



In January of 2005 Dr. Gladys McGarey received a call and a plea for help from one of the children's home in Northern India. These homes were started by her parents in the 1920's for children of lepers. The call was from a young man named Sarabh Masih, Roni to us; the son of Shankar and Pavitra Masih housefather and mother of the Dhanauri Children's Home established by the parents of Dr. Gladys. Roni's parents were children of lepers and raised in another home in Bhogpur.

Dr. Gladys remembered Roni following her brother Dr. John Taylor during his mission work as a dentist in the villages of Northern India in the homes of children of lepers. Dr. John Taylor's work so inspired Roni that he decided to dedicate his life to become a practicing dentist.

Roni's dream, once he finishes his studies, is to take his skills back to the children living in the homes started by the Taylor family. He further hopes to provide dental care in the leper community and other villages in Northern India.

With the creation of the Roni Masih Education Project the Foundation is raising the funds to support this young man through his four and a half years of Dental School. The Journey began on September 15, 2005. To complete his education and meet the financial burden for school, room, food and other expenses we are asking you for your assistance.
